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## 223+ Ways for Prayer in 2023 and Beyond

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One of the wonderful effects of the deepening of our Catholic lives because of the prayerful and faith-filled renewal of Vatican II is that we have discovered and rediscovered the rich heritage of prayer forms which we possess. There is more than one way to pray!

As disciples, committed to living our Baptism, we want to continually deepen our prayer lives

For those of us who are catechetical leaders, working with children, youth, and/or adults, we want to do all we can to lead them to this deepening of their prayer lives. Listed here are several ways. In reality, of course, there are many more. These ideas are prayer practices and methods which can be used in group settings in a short amount of time. The ideas multiply when there are increased opportunities for places, time allotments, and different groupings of people or individuals. Also, the following ideas are ones that can be led by catechetical leaders in various situations, so they do not even touch the summit and source of our prayer as Catholics: the Eucharistic liturgy and the celebration of our sacraments. (So, in reality, as a Catholic people we have many more opportunities than these).

Therefore, celebrate and pray: In your own prayer life and as people gather for parent meetings, for children's sessions, for youth ministry gatherings, for Parish Council and Commission meetings, for family workshops and events, for faith formation sessions, prayerfully try different forms and practices so that as we live and pray in the 21st century, our prayer life -- both individually and as a community -- will deepen and lead us to service.
